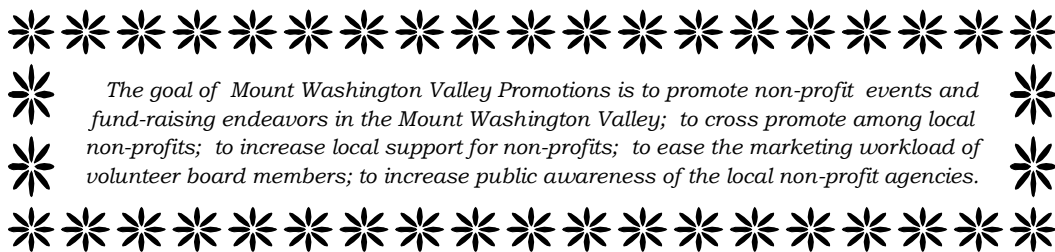

Spotlight: Eastern Slope Ski Club

The Eastern Slope Ski Club was formed in 1935 and is one of the oldest ski organizations in the country. Originally formed as a racing club, the ESSC has evolved to become an organization with a mission to perpetuate skiing and snow-sports in general while offering programs to make them available to the youth of our area.

The most recognized activity of the club is the Junior Ski Program. It is a program offering weekly ski instruction, alpine, cross-country and snowboarding to approximately 1200 elementary school children in the Mt. Washington Valley area. The Junior Ski Program has over 400 volunteers who assist each year. The non-paid cooperation of elementary school faculty also contributes greatly to the success of the program. The Junior Ski Program provides skiing for all interested children, regardless of ability to pay.

The Junior Ski Program is not a school-funded program. While the Junior Ski Program is strongly supported by the schools, funding and administration are provided entirely through the Eastern Slope Ski Club. The program is not a part of the



school budget. Monies to provide this program are raised through membership fees, an annual ski sale, club fund-raising projects, and generous private donations.

Please support a healthy, lifelong activity and become a member or donate to the ESSC. Membership in the club is required to participate in club programs, including the Junior Ski Program.

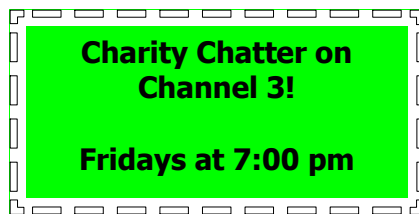
