

Spotlight: MWV Supports Recovery Coalition

MWC Supports Recovery Coalition is a Community Health Center, Saco grassroots organization working promote Awareness-Develop Recovery and Treatment Options and Prevent relapse by offering programs for families and individuals struggling with substance use disorders /addictions. Our goal is to provide services in the Mt. Washington Valley and build a recovery community. We currently provide our annual awareness walk in the fall - Take a Walk in Our Shoes -and we run a weekly family support meeting (FASTER Family groups) on Thursday evenings.

Our initiatives for the 2016 year are to open a family resource and recovery center along with a sober living house. We collaborate with many organizations to develop solutions to the substance use In the last year we have epidemic. partnered with Carroll County Coalition for Public Health, Vaughan Community Services, Kennett High School, Conway Bartlett PD. White Mountain

River Medical, Memorial, numerous individuals and small businesses supporting our efforts.

We act as a steady voice for families individuals seeking understanding of addiction as a disease and work to remove the stigma of addiction through education. We speak and advocate at the local state and federal level and follow legislative initiatives as they roll out.

The Recovery Coalition will help a family or individual from that first call for help through the process of evaluation and treatment options and remove barriers to treatment. We will follow our people through early recovery into long term recovery and give them an opportunity to give back to our organization by mentoring and sharing their experience and strength. With all the tragedy and loss our community seen has



recent years we will continue to offer support to families who have lost loved ones and a pathway out through hope for those ready to embrace a life.

Spotlight: Bartlett Roundhouse Preservation Society

The Bartlett Roundhouse, located along the famed "Mountain Division Rail Line" in Bartlett, NH, was constructed by the Portland and Ogdensburg Railroad. It is the last known standing Portland and Ogdensburg wooden roundhouse. The Roundhouse was a servicing facility for the extra locomotives that were used as "helpers" up the steep grade of Crawford Notch. It was closed in 1958 and sold to the State of New Hampshire in 1959. The State of New Hampshire used it as a Sand and Salt storage shed until the mid 1980's The building began a slow disintegration from the 1980's until 2005-2006, when talks began with the State of NH to save the historic structure. The Bartlett Roundhouse Preservation Society was formed in 2008, it's mission: To preserve and Protect the Bartlett Roundhouse and to collect and maintain an archive of Railroading through Bartlett and

Crawford Notch.

Recent events that have happened include the Roundhouse being listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The interior of the building is empty and clean, all rafters have been sistered and the back of Stall I & II's sills have received attention. The Society received a Stewardship Agreement with the State of New Hampshire last month and has applied for a Moose Plate

Conservation License Plate Grant from the Division of Historical Resources. If the grant is received the rehab of the outside of the building can begin. We also will continue to restore the 1923 Russell wooden snow plow and the 40' outside braced wooden boxcar.


