

### **Spotlight: Carroll County RSVP**

Carroll County Retired & Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) was established in 1971 under the Older American Act and has helped meet the needs and challenges of Carroll County's older adults and adults with disabilities for more than forty years. RSVP is sponsored by the North Conway Community Center.

The mission of RSV is to invite adults age 55 and older to share their life experiences, skill and talents in meaningful volunteer opportunities responding to community needs.

RSVP participates in a wide variety of community activities to include free transportation services that are designed to address the needs of individuals living in Carroll County who are elderly and/or living with disabilities and veterans and are underserved by transportation. The program services are

1.To provide volunteer drivers and escorts to long distance and local medical appointments to ambulatory seniors, adults with disabilities and veterans who need access to life sustaining services. The majority of scheduled transport services are doctor's appointments, physical therapy, chemotherapy, radiation, dentist as well as other professional medical appointments as needed.



The program is tailored to meet the specific needs of the ambulatory seniors, adults with disabilities and veterans. A RSVP volunteer picks up a client at his or her home and delivers the client to the specific medical appointment. The driver waits for the client and then escorts the client safely back to his/her home. The program also provides social time and personal connection with a volunteer, which can make a big difference to the person who needs transportation.

The RSVP Medical Transportation Program allows clients to stay secure, comfortable, independent

and living in their homes for as long as possible. In 2015, RSVP yearly logs show an over 350 individual received services through the RSVP Medical Transportation Program and an average of 2,500 miles per month were needed to accomplish this valued

2.To provide direct transport support to local Meals on Wheels Programs that currently cover six (6) routes to include: Gibson Center Nutrition Program, Moultonboro/Sandwich Meals on Wheels, Ossipee Concerned Citizens, Greater Wakefield Resource Center, Tamworth Community Nurse, and Wolfeboro Meals on Wheels.

In 2015 RSVP drivers for Meals on Wheels programs delivered over 67,425 meals in the above service areas. Total yearly miles logged to provide Meals on Wheels deliveries was 72,192 miles. An additional 13,552 congregate meals were served at the Gibson Center for Senior Services and Conway Congregation Church. RSVP volunteers played an active role in the delivery of these congregate meal programs.


